The Royal British Legion—100 Years of Remembrance



This year the Royal British Legion is marking 100 years since the nation's collective Remembrance traditions were first brought together, such as the poppy, two-minute silence, Armistice Day, the service for the Unknown Warrior, and the march-past at the Cenotaph.

During the First World War almost every household was affected by the loss of a close family member or a friend in the community.

Many of the Remembrance Day services take place outdoors where the risk of Covid transmission is reduced. In accordance with national guidance, the council recommends that members of the public continue to wear face

coverings in crowded and enclosed spaces where they come into contact with people they don't normally meet.

All events in North Tyneside are free to attend and open to anyone.
